- 225 Children participated and read over 5,800 books!
- 19 library programs were attended by over 1,000 children
- 12 teens participated and read over 700 books















- 300 Children participating reading over 10,000 books.
- 25 library programs were attended by over 2,000 children
- 25 teens participated and read over 1400 books
- 4 teen programs

Target Grants

- Early childhood grants are \$2000.
- Grants accepted between 3/1-4/30 with notifications delivered in Sept. (good for one year!)





Rural Arts Grants

- Reimburses payments to artists and performers.
- Deadline is January 18 (for fiscal year July 1st June 30th)
- Used to fund year-long literary projects, writing workshops, and summer reading performances
- Matching grant, can use staff hours/pay to match
- Online grant workshop with how-to's, etc.









- Grant administered by partner organization.
- Deadline is August 31 (for programs Oct- Aug)
- Workshop in late July or early August
- Matching grant, can use staff hours/pay to match
- Up to \$3000





- Community Partnerships and Corporations for:
 - Prizes
 - Craft Supplies
 - Performers
- Scholastic Book Sale





Wish Tree

- Similar to "angel tree"
- Hang your wishes on tree: Funders take the wish they want to fund.
- Potential "Wishes"
 - Books, craft supplies, displays, presenters, monetary gifts for prizes, coupons...






Multi-cultural Children World Map - KT

Outreach –Elementary

- Go as close to end of year as possible.
- Be flexible
- Have a cheat sheet/props
- Costumes/props/puppet get attention.
- Bookmark/Flyer/Calendar with SRP info.
- Give a challenge to the students (pie in the face, dunking booth, etc.)
- Visit Head Starts, too!



Outreach -High School

- Place posters in HS in May
 - 1st week of May visit English classes
 - 2nd week of May set up booth during lunch.
 - Good time to secure a booth for freshman orientation.
 - Don't forget posters at end of school year



- Outreach -Seniors
- Speak to Center directors
- Place poster in centers
- Send SRP flyers with delivered meals.
- Don't forget to pick up posters at the end of the SRP.













Teen Advisory Group

Activities:


- Anime character drawing contest


