




Slaves in cotton field


Slavery debates in Congress



Abolitionist John Rankin




In 1791, Seth Smith, a Pennsylvania stonemason, built the house 0.6 ml. W. of Telford and 300 yds. N. of the road for the Quaker father of Elihu, an early abolitionist, and his brother, Elijah, an early iron-master. The family came from New Jersey. Sarah Hawkins, first wife of John Sevier, is buried near the house.







Ohio house used by the Underground Railroad


Ripley, Ohio: Crossing the Ohio River was the destination






